



First Reading Acts 11:1–18

The Lord taught Peter that racial and cultural differences are not to prevent us from showing lavish love to all people.

The apostles and brothers throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles had also received the word of God. When Peter went up to Jerusalem, those who insisted on circumcision criticized him, saying, "You went to visit men who were uncircumcised and ate with them!" So Peter began to explain everything to them, point by point. He said, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision in which an object like a large sheet was let down from heaven by its four corners. It came right to me. When I inspected it very carefully, I saw fourfooted animals of the earth, wild beasts, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice telling me, 'Get up, Peter! Kill and eat!' "But I replied, 'Certainly not, Lord, for nothing impure or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' "A voice spoke from heaven a second time: 'What God has made clean, you must not continue to call unclean.' This happened three times, and then everything was pulled up into heaven again. "At that very moment, three men who had been sent to me from Caesarea arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them without any hesitation. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he saw an angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and call for Simon, the one called Peter. He will speak words to you by which you and all your household will be saved." "As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit came down on them, just as he came down on us at the beginning. Then I remembered how the Lord had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' So if God gave them the same gift as he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I to try to stand in God's way?" When they heard these things, they had no further objections, and they praised God, saying, "So then, God has granted repentance that results in life also to the Gentiles!"

#### **Second Reading**

1 Corinthians 13:1-13

The defining mark of Christians is not the spiritual gifts that they possess, but it is the lavish love that is demonstrated as they use those gifts for the benefit of others.


If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels but do not have love, I have become a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and know all the mysteries and have all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away everything I own, and if I give up my body that I may be burned but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient. Love is kind. Love does not envy. It does not brag. It is not arrogant. It does not behave indecently. It is not selfish. It is not irritable. It does not keep a record of wrongs. It does not rejoice over unrighteousness but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never comes to an end. But if there are prophetic gifts, they will be done away with; if tongues, they will cease; if knowledge, it will be done away with. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part, but when that which is complete has come, that which is partial will be done away with. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put away childish things. Now we see indirectly using a mirror, but then we will see face to face. Now I know in part, but then I will know fully, just as I was fully known. So now these three remain: faith, hope, and love—and the greatest of these is love.

Grant us these things, Father, for the sake of Jesus, who died and rose again. **Amen.** 







Throughout its 1700-year history, the Nicene Creed has helped Christians keep our eyes focused on the truths that Scripture reveals about God who created us, redeemed us, and sanctified us in the one true faith. #### **Insurance Update**

The Church Council accepted a proposal from Travelers Insurance to insure the building, umbrella, and worker's comp. The new policy is an \$8000 per yr. increase over the previous policy, but was the least expensive option the Council considered. We thank President Shawn Firle for his work on getting bids to consider.

The Council is concerned that we are at a 30 day cushion in the finances heading into the summer months. The summer usually comes with much lower offerings, so the Council encourages our members to be as consistent as possible in worship and with offerings. Online giving includes the option to give while you are at the cabin, campground, or vacation this summer. If you haven't already enrolled, see the information on the counter heading into the Fellowship Hall.
